



**DIVISION 1**  
**TRUMPET DAFFODIL CULTIVARS**  
 One flower to a stem; corona (trumpet) as long as, or longer than the perianth segments (petals).



**DIVISION 2**  
**LARGE-CUPPED DAFFODIL CULTIVARS**  
 One flower to a stem; corona more than one-third, but less than equal to the length of the perianth.



**DIVISION 3**  
**SMALL-CUPPED DAFFODIL CULTIVAR**  
 One flower to a stem; corona not more than one-third the length of the perianth segments.



**DIVISION 4**  
**DOUBLE DAFFODIL CULTIVARS**  
 One or more flowers to a stem, with doubling of the perianth segments or the corona or both.



**DIVISION 5**  
**TRIANDRUS DAFFODIL CULTIVARS**  
 Characteristics of *N.Triandrus* clearly evident: usually two or more pendant flowers to a stem; perianth segments reflexed.



**DIVISION 6**  
**CYCLAMINEUS DAFFODIL CULTIVARS**  
 Characteristics of *N.cyclamineus* clearly evident: one flower to a stem; perianth segments significantly reflexed; flower at an acute angle to the stem, with very short pedicel (neck).



**DIVISION 7**  
**JONQUILLA AND APODANTHUS DAFFODIL CULTIVARS**  
 Characteristics of Sections Jonquilla or Apodanthi clearly evident: one to five (rarely eight) flowers to a stem; perianth segments spreading or reflexed; corona cup-shaped, funnel-shaped or flared, usually wider than long; flowers usually fragment.



**DIVISION 8**  
**TAZETTA DAFFODIL CULTIVARS**  
 Characteristics of Section Tazetta clearly evident: usually three to twenty flowers to a stout stem; perianth segments spreading not reflexed; flowers usually fragrant.



**DIVISION 9**  
**POETICUS DAFFODIL CULTIVARS**  
 Characteristics of the *N.poeticus* group: usually one flower to a stem; perianth segments pure white; corona very short or disc-shaped, usually with a green and/or yellow centre and a red rim, but sometimes of a single colour; flowers usually fragrant.



**DIVISION 10**  
**BULBOCODIUM DAFFODIL CULTIVARS**  
 Characteristics of Section Bulbocodium clearly evident: usually one flower to a stem; perianth segments insignificant compared with the dominant corona; anthers dorsified (ie attached more or less centrally to the filament and style usually curved).

**DIVISION 11**  
**SPLIT CORONA DAFFODIL CULTIVARS**  
 Corona split – usually for more than half its length.

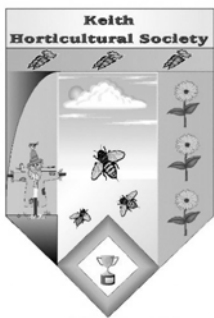


a) Collar Daffodils  
 Split-corona daffodils with the corona segments opposite the perianth segments; the corona segments usually in two whorls of three.



b) Papillon Daffodils  
 Split-corona daffodils with the corona segments alternate to the perianth segments usually in a single whorl of six.

2. All exhibits must be clearly labelled with the name of the variety.
3. Judges are empowered to withhold prize money when the exhibits are deficient in quantity, quality or condition.
4. Entry forms should be lodged with the Show Secretary as early as possible but these will in fact be accepted up to 10pm on Friday evening. Exhibits must have attached a competition label, obtained from the Secretary in exchange for entry forms.
5. The hall will be open for staging exhibits from **4pm to 10pm** on Friday, and from **7am to 9am** on Saturday morning.

## **Exhibitors must clear the Hall by 10pm on Friday evening.**

6. Judging will be carried out between 9am and 11am on the day of the Show and only Stewards will be allowed in the Hall during this time.
7. Judge's decision in all cases will be final. Exhibits only to be removed after 4pm, or after the raffle whichever is soonest, on the day of the Show and before 4.30pm. The Society will not be responsible for exhibits not collected by 4.30pm. Prize Money will be paid in the Hall between 2pm and 4pm. Monies not claimed by then will be recorded as a donation to the Society.

**Materials:** Double knitting wool  
3¼ mm needles.



Cast on 48 stitches

Knit 6 rows.

Continue in stocking stitch until work measures 2 ½ inches.

Knit 2 together knit 6 – repeat to end of row. Next row Purl to end,

Knit 2 together knit 5 – repeat to end of row. Next row Purl to end,

Knit 2 together knit 4 – repeat to end of row. Next row Purl to end,

Knit 2 together knit 3 – repeat to end of row. Next row Purl to end,

Knit 2 together knit 2 – repeat to end of row. Next row Purl to end,

Knit 2 together knit 1 – repeat to end of row. Next row Purl to end,

Knit 2 together 6 times

Thread wool through remaining stitches and fasten off.

Sew up using a flat seam.

Approx 150/200 gm of DK yarn

With 4mm needles cast on 140 stitches.

Rows 1 – 10 Knit to end

Rows 11 – 20

Knit 10, \*Knit 10, Purl 10\* repeat \* to \* until last 10 sts, Knit 10

Rows 21 – 30

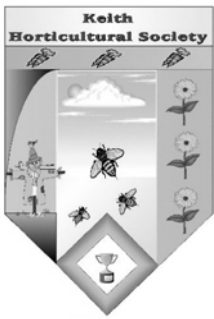
Knit 10, \*Purl 10, Knit 10\* repeat \* to \* until last 10 sts, Knit 10

Continue with this pattern until blanket measures approx 24 inches.

Knit final 10 rows. Cast off.
